








1. EXPLORE ADELAIDE WITH ECOCADDY

- Various tour options available include 60-min City Sights Experience, 90-min Street Art Experience and more.







2. TASTE THROUGH THE ADELAIDE CENTRAL MARKET

4. SWIM WITH WILD DOLPHINS AT GLENELG










4. SWIM WITH WILD DOLPHINS AT GLENELG

- Their catamaran, Temptation, accommodates up to 50 people, complete with a bar, undercover seating area and sound system.






5. TAKE-ON THE ADELAIDE OVAL ROOFCLIMB


- An unforgettable adventure awaits with this exhilarating adventure across Adelaide Oval's iconic roofline.

- Enjoy free tours weekdays at 11am and 2pm.







7. GET UP CLOSE TO KOALA AT CLELAND WILDLIFE PARK

- Cleland Wildlife Park is also one of only a few places in the world where visitors can hold a koala.







8. ENJOY BOUTIQUE SHOPPING AT HAHNDORF


- Located just half an hour from Adelaide,
 Hahndorf is Australia's oldest surviving
 German settlement built in 1839.
- Stroll the tree-lined main street and discover shops, galleries, leathersmith, candle makers, winery cellar doors, chocolatier, traditional sweet shops, restaurants and cafés.
- Don't miss artisan food producers such as Udder Delights cheeses, Buzz Honey, Chocolate @ No. 5 and more.





9. IMMERSE IN MOUNT LOFTY BOTANIC GARDEN

- Mount Lofty Botanic Garden is about 30minute drive from Adelaide city centre.
- Overlooking the picturesque Piccadilly Valley, the garden features displays of cool-climate plants, which thrive on the eastern slopes of Mount Lofty.
- Though jaw-dropping all year-round, the best time to roam the garden is during autumn, when canopies explode with vibrant yellows, reds and oranges.





10. EXPLORE THE SPACE-AGED D'ARENBERG CUBE

- Just 45 minutes from Adelaide, the d'Arenberg Cube in McLaren Vale is a five storey multi-function building set among Mourvèdre vines.
- Each of the five levels have been carefully designed to entice and excite the senses, including features such as a wine sensory room, a virtual fermenter, a 360degree video room, and many other tactile experiences.
